NFA's Residential Sprinkler Plan Review

The scope of this **free** two-day course looks at the following as the primary guidance for the approval of residential sprinkler systems:

- National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 13, Standard for the Installation of Sprinkler Systems.
- NFPA 13D, Standard for the Installation of Sprinkler Systems in One- and Two-Family Dwellings and Manufactured Homes.
- NFPA 13R, Standard for the Installation of Sprinkler Systems in Low-Rise Residential Occupancies.
- International Residential Code Standard P2904.
- Manufacturer's Data Sheets.
- The ability to read and interpret the design is an essential element of preventive fire safety.

The target audience for the Residential Sprinkler Plan Review course is building and fire code officials whose responsibility is to review and approve residential sprinkler plans. Such officials include fire inspectors, fire marshals, and building code inspectors with at least 1 year experience on the job.
